

## Milestones Matter

# Your Baby at 10 to 12 Months

How your child plays, learns, speaks, acts and moves offers important clues about his or her development.

#### **Your Child's Communication**

- By age 10 months, reaches for objects
- Points, waves and shows or gives objects
- Imitates and initiates gestures for engaging in social interactions and playing games, like blowing kisses or playing peek-a-boo
- Tries to copy sounds that you make
- · Enjoys dancing
- Responds to simple words and phrases like "go bye-bye" and "look at Mommy"
- Says one or two words like "mama," "dada,"
  "hi" and "bye"

Each child develops uniquely, even within the same family, and may meet certain milestones earlier or later then others. If your child does not meet many of the milestones within their age range, or if you have any concerns about your child's hearing or development, it is important to act early. It can make a big difference!

It's also important to note that the communication (hearing, speech and language) milestones and cutoffs are for American English speakers. Speech-language development for children who speak languages outside of spoken American English may follow a different sequence or have different rates of mastery by age range.

## You Can Help Your ChildLearn and Grow

Here are some activities to enjoy with your baby.

- Pay attention to your child's hearing. See if they turn to noise or look at you when you talk.
- Look for signs like crying while they are pulling on their ears, which could mean ear problems or infections. If you are concerned, see a doctor.
- **Respond to your child.** Look at them when they make noises. Talk to them. Imitate the sounds they make.
- Make silly faces with them. Laugh when they do.
- Teach your baby to copy actions, like peek-a-boo, clapping, blowing kisses and waving bye-bye. This teaches them how to take turns and use gestures.
- Talk about what you do during the day. Say things like "Mommy is washing your hair," "You are eating peas" and "Oh, these peas are good!"
- Talk about where you go, what you do there and who and what you see. Say things like "We are going to Grandma's house. Grandma has a dog. You can pet the dog."
- Teach animal sounds like "A cow says 'moo."
- Sing, tell stories or read to your child every day.
- Talk to your child in the languages you are most comfortable using. Early exposure helps your child learn language best.
- Build on what they say or try to say.
- Talk about and label what you see while riding in the car or going for walks.
- Sing songs with actions such as Itsy-Bitsy Spider or Wheels on the Bus.



If you have concerns, you can talk to your child's pediatrician, schedule a clinical evaluation or call your child's school district. You can also use ASHA ProFind (asha.org/profind) to find an ASHA-certified audiologist (asha.org/public/who-are-audiologists) or speech-language pathologist (asha.org/public/who-are-speech-language-pathologists) for an assessment.

For children 1 year (12 months) of age and up, you can also sign up for a free online or in-person speech, language and hearing screening with a speech-language pathologist from Boys Town National Research Hospital by emailing screenings@boystown.org or calling 531-355-5605.
