

Activities to Consider When Transferring Your Child to a New School District

- ▶ Contact your child's current district to let them know your child will be leaving
 - Gather evaluations, IEP, and progress reports from your child's current school. If your child receives outside services, ask for a discharge summary to share with the new school
 - Ask current IEP team for ideas to share that might help the student transition to the new school

- ▶ Contact the new school/district to let them know your child will be attending
 - Ask the new district for any forms or paperwork needed to enroll your child
 - Contact the new district Special Education Coordinator as soon as possible with the goal of learning if they will continue your child's current IEP or if they want to start the process over with a new evaluation
 - Arrange a meeting between you, your child and the new district special education coordinator to talk about the transition and steps that can be taken to help ensure a successful start at their new school
 - Review the new school's policies, by downloading the student handbook and discussing the school's rules with your child

- ▶ Enroll your child in courses (MS/HS), extracurricular activities and transportation services, if applicable
 - Meet with your child's IEP team at the new school
