## About the Boys Town Special

According to Omaha lore, the Reuben Sandwich was dreamed up at Omaha's Blackstone Hotel in 1925 by Reuben Kulakofsky, a local grocer, to feed a group of late-night poker players. Charles Schimmel, one of the players and the hotel's owner, liked it so much he put it on the menu of The Plush Horse, the hotel restaurant.

Boys Town has its own special connection to a "Reuben" through the iconic Two Brothers statue. The statue was inspired by a photograph of two youth who lived at Boys Town. One of them, Howard Loomis, suffered from polio and wore heavy braces on his legs, which made it difficult for him to get around. Because of this, Howard was often seen being carried around campus by the older boys. In this photo, Howard is seen riding on the back of fellow resident Reuben Granger. When asked by Father Flanagan if Howard was getting heavy, Reuben famously replied, "**He ain't heavy, Father, he's my brother!**"
